Q& A

President's Report by Lily Knezevich

On March 8th, Mayor Eric Jackson and five members of his senior staff attended a special meeting of the Hiltonia Association. According to our non-scientific count, about 55 neighbors turned out. The mayor spoke about his accomplishments and the projects that are underway to improve the vitality of the City. He also took questions. The mayor and his team stayed for about one hour -- time ran out prior to getting to all the questions. Below is my summary of his responses to the questions we were able to ask at the meeting, and the responses to questions I submitted by email to Francis Blanco, the mayor's chief of staff.

- Abandoned and unsecured properties: Advice we received about 9 Cadwalader or similar properties is to: (1) report to police via My Block; (2) Police will contact Merkle Cherry (Director of Public Works); he will send out inspectors, who can file complaints; (3) TPD will then be able to issue citations and secure property. Mayor Jackson and Captain Gonzalez were eager to remind our neighborhood to utilize My Block: <u>http://</u> trentonpolice.com/my-block.html
- Trenton Water Works: TWW is limited in its hiring by residency requirements, but work is underway to locate the appropriate technical staff to fill open positions and positions that will be vacated in the future. Dir. Cherry has made a commitment to reduce vacancies by 30% in next six months.
- **Density and Affordable Housing:** Mayor Jackson reported on various projects underway, such as Roebling Lofts and Bell Telephone building.
- Trenton 250 vs. State of NJ plan for its structures downtown: Mayor Jackson explained that the city cannot dictate terms to the State. His understanding is that "mixed use" refers to blocks or sections of blocks, not to individual buildings. Mayor Jackson is working to the best of his ability to have input in the State's plans.
- Any hope for a reinstatement of the city's Enterprise Zone status? See answer to prior question.

- Will the City ever recover the \$4.7 million IPS payroll company embezzled? The mayor explained that this was a federal financial crime and that the City will be made (almost) whole by means of the courts' imposition of various penalties on the perpetrator, including the likelihood of court-ordered restitution to the City.
- **Branch libraries**: There is no money in the budget for opening the libraries. but the City is working with the library board and Friends of Trenton Libraries.
- Yard Waste: The city will be working with me to get the gutters cleared of leaves.
- Litter: The City is about to begin an anti-litter pilot program, and we are hoping Hiltonia will be included. This is the C.L.E.A.Neighborhoods program. The community liaison for TCCA on this pilot is Bernard McMullen.
- When will the new taxes on the reassessed value take effect—in May or August? The revalued assessments will affect the third and fourth quarter billings, but the third and fourth quarter billings will include the balances due (if any) from the first and second quarter already billed, which were estimates based on last year's figures.
- Why did the assessed value of some residents' land almost double? Taxes are paid on total assessed values. The improvement values are calculated using standard appraisal practices and the remainder is attributed to the land.
- Will senior citizens get a freeze on any increased property taxes? Only if they qualify under existing State programs.
- Trenton Boards and Trenton Commissions: Finally, Mayor Jackson made a strong plea to the residents of Hiltonia who have the time and the interest to volunteer for one or more of the several important commissions or boards, including the Board of Education, that work to improve our city. The city needs your talent and your vision.
